Peter Teasher, David Hagar, Johannes Davis, Henrich Stall, Johannes Flender, Leonard Senably, George Scheffer, Henry Weschenbach, Ludwig Kamerer, Jost Zimmerman, Johannes Eydenauer, Matthias Otto, and Christophe Rever, German Protestants, severally came into court here this 21<sup>st</sup> day of September, 1764 between the hours of nine and twelve in the forenoon, and, in pursuance of an act of Parliament, made and passed in the thirteenth year of the reign of his late majesty, King George the Second, intituled “An act for the naturalizing [of] such foreign Protestants and others as are settled or shall settle in any of His Majesty’s colonies in America” pray to have their several oaths prescribed by the said act administered to them respectively, they having produced the following certificates of having received the sacrament in Frederick County the 16<sup>th</sup> day of August, 1764. This is to certify that Joseph Greybill and Peter Teasher have received the sacrament the 14<sup>th</sup> day of this instant by me.
